## JOINT PUBLIC NOTICE/NEWS RELEASE CITIES OF HERCULANEUM/PEVELY

To the Citizens of Hercualnuem and Pevely:

The Cities of Herculanuem and Pevely recently installed an Early Warning Storm System. The System has various sirens along with various recorded voice messages. Both cities conduct a monthy test of the system, on the third Monday of every month at 10:00 a.m. which consist of a siren along with a text message stating this is a test. The Early Warning System consist of two warnings.

Tornado Warning will be sounded when:

The National Weather Service issues a Tornado Warning, which includes the area east of Highway 21, south of Highway 141, and north of Highway 110.

Severe Thunder Storm Warning is sounded when:

The National Weather Service issues a Severe Storm Warning and the following conditions are met.

60 (sixty) mile per hour winds, and the City of Herculaneum and Pevely are in the path of the storm.

In order to familiarize the public with the sounds of the sirens and the text messages of the Early Warning System a test will be conducted on Wednesday, September 17, at 6:00 p.m. This testing will give everyone a better understanding of how the system works. The entire exercise will last for 20 minutes, and include the siren response to the Tornado Warning and Severe Thunder Storm Warning.

This testing is in addition to the monthly testing done on the third Monday of every month at 10:00 a.m.

In case of inclement weather the siren testing would be rescheduled to September 24th at 6:00p.m.
